### **ENGLISH WEEK 2021**

### I HAVE A VOICE! COMPETITION

9<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> Grade

- 1. One participant per school.
- 2. The teacher will register the student for the competition.
- 3. The student will select and sing a song in the English Language. They will be judged by their pronunciation and singing talent.
- 4. The competitions must be virtual by submitting a pre-recorded video with the same criteria below. The video submitted cannot be edited in any way or have pauses.
- 5. The video submitted must show the student performing the song from start to finish, with lips visible and in perfect synchronization with the lyrics.
- 6. Include in the video a 1-2 second introduction (name, name of the school, municipality, and region, the teacher's name, and the title of the song).
- 7. During the competition, the students must wear the school's uniform.
- 8. The competition will require three judges, including a Fine Arts Music professor.
- 9. The teacher must verify the song. It must not contain delicate subjects, profanity words, or vulgar language. If this rule is violated, the student will be disqualified.
- 10. The student cannot post the video to any social media; other institutions or companies, if so the student will be immediately disqualified.
- 11. The song must not exceed 5 minutes.
- 12. The first-place winner will perform the same song live for the Statewide Competition.
- 13. The student must bring the downloaded video of the song in Karaoke version. It must be in good quality. That is the file they will use to perform.
- 14. This video submitted must be verified that it can be played in our sound system.
- 15. The judges will use a rubric for each student. The student with the highest score will win.
- 16. The decisions of the judges are final.

Note: English teachers are responsible in explaining the rules and rubric to all students and parents.
